General manuscript preparation instructions

The Asian Journal of Lung Health is published biannually by the Sri Lanka College of Pulmonologists. Material received for publication is assumed to be submitted exclusively to the Asian Journal of Lung Health and becomes the copyright of the journal. The journal accepts original research, research letter, editorials, reviews, case reports and case series, chest imaging and pathology for clinicians, letter to the editor, and response to letter to the editor. All authors must give signed consent for publication.

Guidelines for specific article types

Original research

All original research should be submitted with a structured abstract divided into following sections: Background, Methods, Results, Conclusions and clinical trial number where relevant. The text should be categorised into the following sections: Introduction (not labelled), Methods, Results, and Discussion. Finally, author contributions and references should be added. All original research must include the name of the ethical clearance committee and institutional review board approval in the Methods section.

Research letter

Focused research findings of potential clinical impact but not large enough for complete research publication can be submitted as a research letter in following sections: Introduction (not labelled), Methods, Results and Discussions. The maximum number of figures and/or tables allowed is two.

Editorials

The editorial team will invite experts to discuss the findings of the research and to share their perspectives, the impact of the findings on medical practice, and the need for future researche.

Case reports and case series

A novel entity, presentations, mechanisms, diagnostic methods, and treatment of a disease can be submitted as a case report or a case series. A maximum of three figures and/or tables are permitted, and patient

written consent should be obtained for publication. The patients' privacy must be preserved.

The format of the case report or series is as follows, Title, Abstract (Introduction, Case presentation, Conclusions), Introduction, Case presentation, Discussion, Conclusions, Abbreviations, References

Chest imaging and pathology for clinicians

This section is designed to understand the correlation of clinical findings with radiology and pathology. The submission should include a distinct presentation of a disease process.

The format is as follows:

Title, Case presentation, Q: What is the diagnosis?, A:Answer, Discussion, Conclusion

Images considerations

All images should be of high quality and in a suitable format. The figures should be numbered in the order they are mentioned in the text. Figure titles (maximum 15 words) and legends (maximum 150 words) should be provided in the main manuscript.

References

Keep references to a reasonable minimum and indicate them in the text only by Arabic superior numerals in the order of appearance. At the end of the article, give the full list of references in the correct numerical order with the name(s) and initial(s) of the author(s), followed by the title of the article, the title of the journal in full, the year and volume number, and the first and last page numbers. Titles of books should be followed by the place of publication, the publisher, and the year. Example,

Sheriff MHR, Sheriffdeen AH, Jayasekara G. The first kidney transplantation in Sri Lanka. *Ceylon Medical Journal* 1987;**32**:15-27.

Preparing the main manuscript

The manuscript should be in Microsoft word format with double line spacing. All the units should be SI units, and drugs should be generic.

Submission

All manuscripts should be sent via email (Email:asianjournaloflunghealth@gmail.com) and copied to the chief editor (Email: chiefeditorajlh@gmail.com) and assistant editor (Email: assistanteditorajlh@gmail.com). The first page should include the title of the article, the name(s), initials, qualifications, and post(s) held by each author at the time they did the work.

Manuscripts submitted to the journal must not have been published elsewhere and should not be under consideration for publication in any other journal. Submissions should only be made by one of the authors listed on the paper. The submitting author takes full responsibility for the paper during the submission and peer-review process.

Once a paper is accepted, it cannot be withdrawn at any cost. Please consider this commitment seriously before submitting your manuscript.

The following documents should be sent along with the main manuscript: Cover letter, Figures and Consent form, where relevant.

Peer review

All manuscripts are subject to peer review by anonymous reviewers to ensure academic excellence. If approved by the editor, submissions will be considered by peer reviewers whose identities will remain anonymous to the authors.
